THE BULLS MASTERS' AIM

The Bulls Masters is an organisation of former QLD cricketers established in 2010 to develop and grow the game of cricket throughout the state. The aim of the Bulls Masters is to foster and develop cricket using retired QLD cricketers as well as providing community support and assisting charities along the way. The Bulls Masters was founded by a group of former state and national cricketers; Ian Healy, Martin Kent, Jimmy Maher, Andy Bichel and Michael Kasprovicz. The Foundation Members, with all except Martin Kent sitting on the Bulls Masters' Board. The Bulls Masters visits regional communities providing coaching and development to young cricketers and supporting local cricket clubs and charities. The organisation works closely with regional communities to providing opportunities for fundraising, and support the growth of the game. The Bulls Masters conducts regional Tours per year; conducting school and hospital visits, playing cricket matches and creating fundraising events in local areas. The Bulls Masters enjoys the generous support of its commercial partners and a well established membership base to fund operations. The Bulls Masters is a non profit organisation that aims to be a positive and beneficial influence on people's lives through interaction and education using our personnel as the vehicle to drive positive change. The Bulls Masters is extremely proud of its ability to visit a vast array of towns and have an impact on people's lives via hospital visits, fundraising for charity, encouraging children to get active and play sport, discovering and nurturing indigenous talent and helping to improve local facilities.



MANAGING DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Over many years, sport prepares people for the unexpected. You learn to cope with days of great triumph and days of disappointment. That experience helped the Bulls Masters in 2019/20 as we joined other sports-based organisations in dealing with the impacts of COVID19. We were quite fortunate to have completed the most of our annual calendar when the pandemic began – we sympathise with other organisations who did not have that good fortune. Our changes included the postponement of our Gatton and Emerald tours and one of our fundraisers in Cairns. Of course, we also had to place on hold the 25-year anniversary of the first ever Sheffield Shield win. We will make all of these up in time – that's not in doubt. And we are very conscious that many clubs, communities and grass roots organisations are going to need the Bulls Masters more than ever to help rebuild in tough times.

Prior to COVID, Bulls Masters once again had an extremely satisfying year across all levels. We continued our work throughout regional Queensland and we continued our role as the major sponsor of the Queensland Bulls, the Queensland Fire and the Brisbane Grade competition.

Our charter remains unchanged: to deliver opportunities, tournaments, events for fundraising, support causes outside of cricket, provide specialist coaching for both players and coaches and to engage the former Queensland players. We want to do this consistently and with quality. Those goals are not negotiable.

We are so fortunate to have the enthusiasm and support of former Queensland players. Their commitment is incredible and we constantly hear from other states how they envy the network that has been created in Queensland.

Mackay remained an important destination for the Bulls Masters as host of our Under 16 Youth Cup. Eight former players were engaged to mentor the teams. The successful team was the South East Queensland Stormers winning the Youth Cup. The Matthew Hayden Medallist was Finn Churchwood from the Far North Fusion.

The Country Challenge and the Youth Cup are very important parts of the Bulls Masters calendar and they will continue to grow each year, helping to develop more players along our pathway. Well done to all participants.

Ian Healy is a former QLD and Australian cricketer; a prolific member of the Australian cricket team from 1998 he was a specialist wicket keeper and an integral part of a dominant decade in Australian cricket.

Ian played 119 Tests for Australia and was named in the team of the 21st century. Ian had a long and proud career with QLD cricket; as captain from 1992 until 2000.

Ian began his career in the central QLD town of Biloela before moving to Brisbane to begin playing at Norths Cricket Club. Ian retains his involvement with Norths Cricket Club



MARK THOMPSON

He is also the founder and Managing director of consultancy firm, Venture India, facilitating trade and business opportunities between India and Australia. Michael is currently a Board member of the Australian India Council appointed by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. Michael holds an MBA from the University of Queensland.



JIMMY MAHER

Born and raised in Cairns Jimmy Maher is a proud Queenslander, representing Australia and QLD.

Making his debut for the Queensland Bulls in 1993/94, Jimmy has continued to be an integral part of a winning team. Named as Queensland Bulls Player of the Year (2001/02) Jimmy is one of only seven players to have played more than 100 'First Class Games' for the state and in 2002 stepped up as Captain.

Jimmy was part of the Australian side during the 2003 World Cup after making his ODI Australian debut in 1998.

He was a founding director of the Bulls Masters and has been the managing director since the organisation's beginning in 2010.



ANDY BICHEL

Andy Bichel, hails from the Laidley in the Lockyer Valley he started his playing career with QLD in 1992 and continued as a member of the QLD state team until 2008; a long term member of the QLD Bulls a medium fast bowler. Andy was a key member of the Australian World Cup winning team in 2003.

After retiring from cricket Andy moved into coaching and developing young bowlers; as a director of coaching in PNG, and bowling coach for Indian Premier League teams the Chennai Superkings and Kolkata Knightriders. Bichel was also an Australian Cricket Selector from 2012 – 2014.

He has been a member of the Bulls Masters board since the organisation's inception and continues to support the organisation by travelling with the Bulls Masters.

They will look back on 30 years since Queensland's triumph and Australia's Ashes victory.

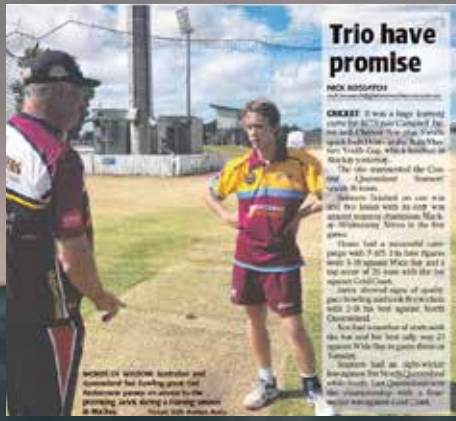





1 Corporate Information

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Preparation

These financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*. The directors have determined that the company is not a reporting entity.

The report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001* and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

- AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial statements.

(b) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the company is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(c) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of the GST incurred on a purchase of goods and services is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense.

Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount recoverable from, or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included as part of receivables and payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities, which is recoverable from or payable to the Australian Taxation Office are classified as operating cash flows.

(d) Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The directors evaluate estimates and judgements incorporated into the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the company. Details of critical accounting estimates and assumptions about the future made by management at the end of the reporting period are set out below:

Sponsorship revenue is recognised as performance obligations are satisfied. Judgement is applied in determining the timing of performance obligations being satisfied.

(e) New, Revised or Amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations Adopted

The following new accounting standards and became mandatory for adoption in the 2020 financial year:

AASB 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers

The standard contains a single model that applies to contracts with customers and two approaches to recognising revenue: at a point in time or over time. The model features a contract-based five-step analysis of transactions to determine whether, how much and when revenue is recognised. The standard became effective for the year ended 30 June 2020 for not-for-profit entities.

This adoption has not caused a material impact on the company.

- Recognise all lease assets and liabilities (including those previously classed as operating leases) on the statement of financial position, initially measured at the present value of unavoidable lease payments;
- Recognise amortisation of lease assets and interest on lease liabilities as expenses over the lease term; and
- Separate the total amount of cash paid into a principal portion (presented within financing activities) and interest (presented within operating activities consistent with presentation of other interest paid) in the statement of cash flows.

The Company has adopted AASB 16. On transition on 1 July 2019, the Group recognised right-of-use assets and corresponding lease liabilities of \$37,600.





The audit report issued is unmodified other than an emphasis of matter explaining that the financial statements are prepared as a special purpose report.

New Accounting Standards

New accounting standards AASB 15 *Revenue from Contracts with Customers* and AASB 16 *Leases* are first time effective 1 July 2019. These new accounting standards were adopted in the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2020.



Appendix 2 - Weaknesses Identified In Management Information Systems

This appendix sets out details of weaknesses in accounting systems and internal controls, as well as comments on the adequacy of management information systems.

Our communication only includes matters that have come to our attention as a result of the performance of the audit and our audit of the financial report is not designed to identify all matters that may be relevant to management. Accordingly, the audit does not ordinarily identify all such matters.

The responsibility for producing the financial statements and ensuring adequate internal controls and sound business practices is the responsibility of management, and is a part of management's overall responsibility for the ongoing activities of the entity. Policies and procedures developed by the entity to safeguard its assets and to provide reasonable assurance that errors and irregularities or illegal acts are promptly identified, must be properly monitored to ensure that all staff are complying with the guidelines provided. Where we determined, from our testing, that there exists a need for improvement in existing systems of internal control, or if we detected that the entity's staff are not complying with the critical accounting policies and procedures provided by management, we increased our year-end testing of account balances to ensure that audit risk was kept to an appropriate low level.

The comments and concerns expressed herein did not have a material effect on the entity's financial report and, as such, our opinion thereon was without reservation. However, in order for the entity to ensure the safeguarding of its assets and the accuracy of its records, we believe our comments and concerns should be taken into consideration by management and those charged with governance. Our comments are not intended to reflect upon the honesty or competence of the entity's employees.

1. Leave Entitlements

We noted that annual leave accrual and long service leave provision did not include oncosts (superannuation, work cover). Annual leave accrual and long service leave provisions are understated at 30 June.

Recommendation

We recommend that oncosts are applied to annual leave accrual and long service leave provision.

2. MYOB Access

We noted from review of the User Access screen in MYOB, the current External Accountants (Thompson Partners), old External Accountants (Whytes), current Auditors and ex-auditors (Sasha) have an active Administrator user access role. Furthermore, the Administration Manager at Bulls Masters has an active Sales user access role.

Recommendation

We recommend deactivating the roles for Whytes and Sasha.
